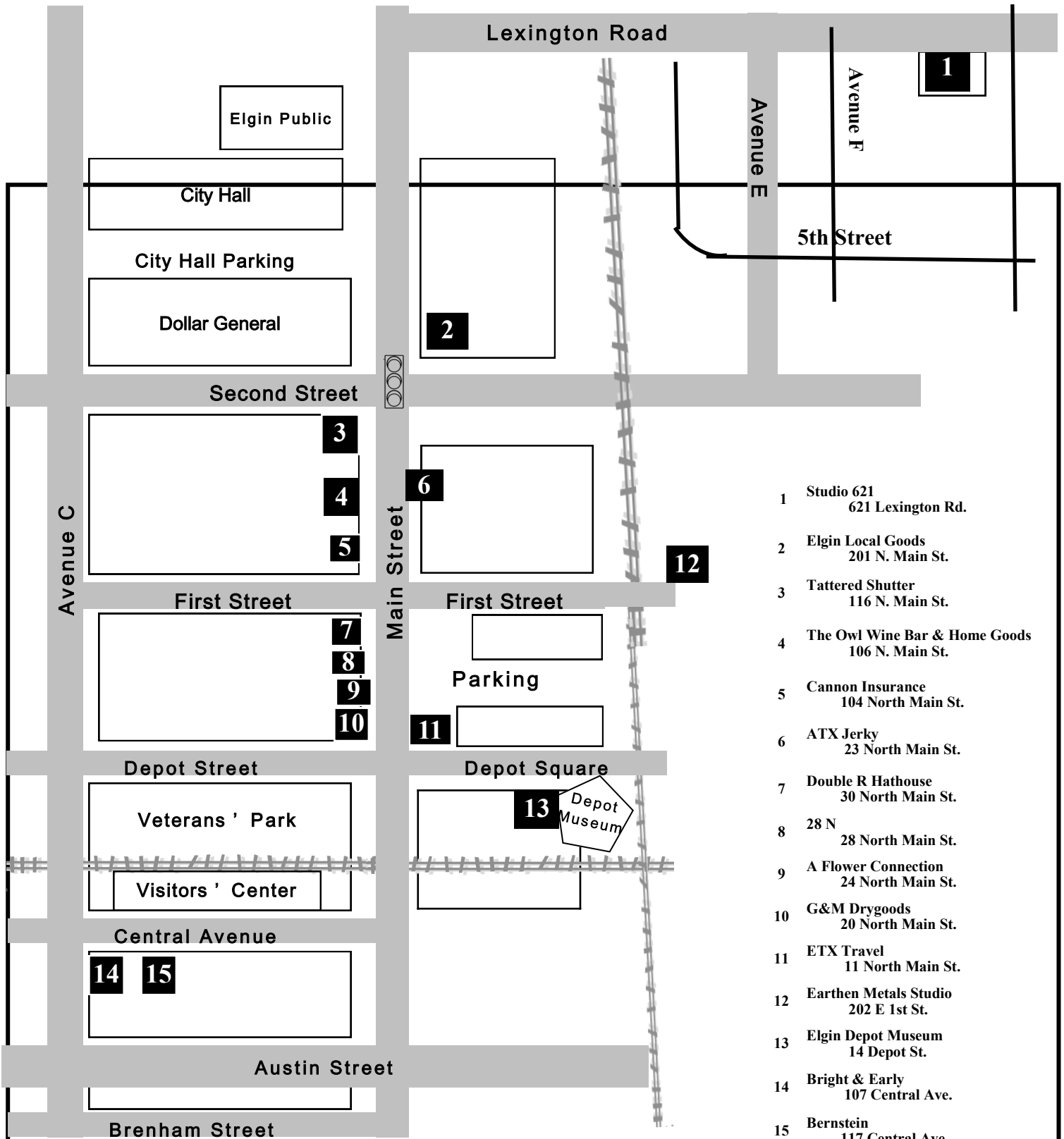

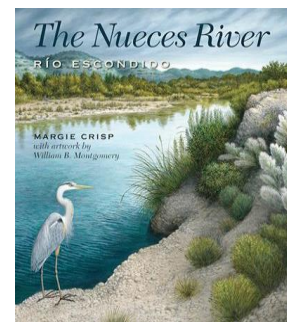

Tell Me Your Story in Elgin, Texas on May 19 and 20, 2018

Summary:

The *Tell Me Your Story* project of Bernstein Documentary at 117 Central Ave., in the historic district of Elgin, Texas, will launch its premier *question of the day* during the 2018 Artist Studio Tour, May 19-20.

The *Tell Me Your Story* audio booth in the window at 117 Central Ave., will be open to the public, between **10AM to 6PM on Saturday, May 19th and from 12- 4PM on Sunday, May 20th**. Reception and playback, as well as a dance party, from 4-8 PM on May 20th. Self identified young and old people welcome.

The *question of the day* will be posted on the window's banner both mornings, May 20th and 21st.

Examples of questions to be posted are, "do you remember your first prom date?", "what do you like or dislike most about waking up at home?", "do you like to cook and why?". But, in truth, we encourage your stories about anything, as long as it is important to you. We love people who go off topic and nothing is boring !

All interviews are YOUR property although we do hope to archive recordings for a time capsule project with Elgin's Depot Museum.

Succulents will be sold on that day as well to subsidize costs of recording, editing and establishing the archive for *Tell Me Your Story*.

Recently lauded at the Sundance Film Festival and South by Southwest Film Festival, *Richard Linklater – dream is destiny* is about to be distributed nationally by IFC Films and Hulu, with overseas distribution by the sales agent, Dogwoof. More information on the documentary and it's screenings at www.linklaterdoc.com 2015 also saw the release of a Galan Inc. documentary that Karen Bernstein co-produced with Latino Public Broadcasting, *Children of Giant*.

In her role as a series producer for American Masters and producer of *Ella Fitzgerald – Something To Live For* (1999), Bernstein received a national Emmy award for Outstanding Non-Fiction Series. For producing *Lou Reed – Rock and Roll Heart* (1998), she received a Grammy award. In 2000 she co-produced American Masters/ *Juilliard* (2002) and American Masters/ *Clint Eastwood*. Her work has been screened at over 100 international film festivals including Sundance and Berlin. *Body of War* was produced with Phil Donahue and Ellen Spiro, toured film festivals around the world, and was shortlisted for an Academy award in 2008. The ITVS funded film, *Troop 1500*, also did an extensive tour around film festivals both in this country and abroad and was broadcast on Independent Lens in 2006.

Both *Are The Kids Alright?* and *Producing Light* have won Emmys in Texas. Her web video for Etsy.com on the craft movement in Marfa (<http://www.etsy.com/blog/en/?s=Marfa+no+place+like+here&submit=Search>) conjured over 250,000 hits on the Etsy website and was re-tweeted on BoingBoing and Huffington Post in 2010. Current projects include the documentary feature, *I'm Going To Make You Love Me*, and *La Vie En Rose*, part of the Patina project.

transFIGURATION, a documentary program for PBS on a collaboration between the photographer, Rino Pizzi, and 12 Texas-based artists, was broadcast in May, 2014, and exists as a permanent KLRU web link (<http://www.klru.org/episode/arts-in-context/transfiguration/>). With the high definition satellite TV series, Gallery HD, she produced two documentaries about two Texas artists and groups, Julie Speed and the innovative gallery, Ballroom Marfa. Her short film on Elizabeth Streb (*PopACTION*), dancer and choreographer, was awarded a New York State Council on the Arts grant.

Present projects include *Patina/ La Vie En Rose*, a short film documentary, and *I'm Gonna Make You Love Me*, a feature film documentary about Tish/ Brian and a world of survival between both weddings.
